Vaccine Rollout

Last week Dr. Bonnie Henry released B.C.'s <u>COVID-19 vaccine rollout plan</u>. Based on scientific evidence and expert guidance, the plan is designed to save lives and stop the spread of COVID-19. We are putting the health and safety of our most vulnerable at the centre of our plan. The greatest risk factor for severe illness and death from COVID-19 is age. That is why Phase 1 has focused on immunizing long-term care residents and the people who care for them.

Phase 2 will begin in late February, and expands immunization to all seniors 80 and over, as well as health care staff and Indigenous seniors and Elders over 65.

Phase 3 (beginning of April) will expand to include people aged 60-79, as well as other adults who are clinically extremely vulnerable due to health concerns.

And starting in July, Phase 4 will see everyone in B.C. aged 18-59 who wants a vaccine, receiving one. This will happen in five-year increments working backwards, meaning the 55-59-year-old group will be first, then those aged 50-54, and so on, down to the 18-24 age group.

Right now, the two vaccines that are available in Canada are not recommended for most children. We are reviewing the evidence carefully and will continue to base our decisions on the best available science.

I know everyone is eager to find out when their turn will come. Remember that while it might not be your turn just yet, every single person in B.C. who gets the vaccine helps reduce the spread and makes us all a little bit safer. I would like to acknowledge the disappointment and anxiety that comes from the stalling of the vaccines' arrival to Canada. It is reassuring that people are eager to receive their inoculations, and buoyed to know that our patience and vigilance equals kindness, calmness, and safeness.

More Health Care Assistant training locally and throughout the province

Our government recognizes the need for more health care assistants, and it's so great to see these extra seats coming to North Island College. The New Democrat government is creating 16 new seats in the health care assistant program at North Island College, between the Comox Valley and Campbell River campuses. These are some of the 600 new seats being created at public post-secondary institutions across the province, as part of the Health Career Access Program, with a total investment of \$8.4 million. This is one part of BCs Economic Recovery plan to help
