Just a few days before Christmas and still there is such great progress being made in order to economically get BC through this tough year, take real action in cleaning up our environment, and support those who need help right now. I had to share this good news with you. Please take a look at some of the positive things coming to our community even as we all do our part to keep it safe throughout the holiday season.

Small and Medium business grant changes

The BC Government has been listening to businesses and stakeholders to learn how to improve the BC grants program and to expand eligibility. The number one priority is to get the money out the door to eligible businesses as soon as possible. Based on this review several adjustments have been made including a simplified application process and streamlined criteria that will make it easier for businesses to apply and get funding that will help them access \$10,000 and \$30,000 in non-repayable grants. The requirements for businesses to be in operation have been lowered from three years to 18 months at the time of application. Delivery fee caps for Restaurants

An Emergency Program Act (EPA) order has been created to place a temporary cap on fees charged to restaurants from food delivery companies to 15%, in order to provide immediate relief to our local businesses to ensure they can keep their business running and retain staff. An additional cap of 5% is also included for other related fees associated with use of the service, such as online ordering and processing fees. This will ensure that companies cannot shift their delivery costs to other fees. This EPA order will be in effect until 3 months after the Provincial State of Emergency is lifted. New cleanup funds to protect coastal waters, create jobs

Our government is providing more than \$9.5 million for projects to clear B.C.'s shores of marine debris and derelict vessels through the Clean Coast, Clean Waters Initiative Fund. This program will reduce pollution in sensitive ecosystems and protect fish and marine life. Provincial grants funding community arts, culture, sports

We want to ensure that the arts, culture and sports communities continue to enhance our quality pf life in our communities. The BC government is providing \$45 million to local organizations in Community Gaming Grants for arts, culture and sports programs. When we can be together again we'd like to ensure that we can fully embrace these important aspects of our communities.

More support for friendship centres benefits urban Indigenous peoples during pandemic

Our government is committed to supporting Indigenous peoples across the province during this particularly challenging time. This one-time COVID-19 relief funding of \$7.8 million will help friendship centres continue to assist individuals, young families, single parents, youth and Elders through a mix of in-person and online services. The grant will help provide supports like meals and hampers, care packages for seniors and education kits for children. It aims to address three main priorities: 1) food security; 2) personal protective equipment and sanitization; and 3) equipment and supplies.

During the holidays, please be vigilant especially as we are beginning to see the light at the end of the tunnel in controlling this virus. We must hold on to what we've been practicing for the last 9 months. I'm very proud to be serving as your representative and I wish you all the best this cozy holiday season.
