Highlight:

On May 2nd the government of British Columbia took a massive step in dismantling systemic racism by introducing the anti-racism data act. This act will help identify gaps in programs and services, and allow government to better meet the needs of Indigenous, Black and racialized British Columbians. It is with great pride that this is the first of it's kind in Canada and was co-developed with Indigenous Peoples. When it was introduced in the house there was a unanimous standing ovation. I am extremely proud to be a part of these actions that are making a difference today

Nurses Week

May 9th – 15th was Nursing week! We applaud nurses for their dedication and are working still to recover from years of underfunding in the previous government.

In Question Period last Tuesday, Minister of Health, Adrian Dix gave an excellent summary of some actions currently happening to support our BC nurses:

"The exceptional actions that have taken place throughout our health care system over the last two years have resulted in some of the best outcomes in the world with respect to the COVID-19 pandemic. That's the work of nurses, and the member is right to say they deserve credit.

But I have to say this. When you look at what's happened with nursing in B.C.... The members opposite talk about the numbers of nurses. LPNs up 11.9 percent. Registered nurses — not my numbers, the college — up 15.1 percent from 2017 to 2020. Registered psychiatric nurses up 16 percent. Nurse practitioners up more than 100 percent. Those are the numbers. That's what has happened.

Is that sufficient? I don't think so. That's why we're adding more nursing spaces. That's why we're making it easier for internationally educated nurses to come."
