Minister's statement on Cullen Commission's final report

Under the BC Liberals, there was a serious, decade-long problem of organized crime laundering hundreds of millions of dollars in BC casinos. B.C. INVESTS IN FIRST NATIONS LANGUAGE, ARTS, CULTURE AND HERITAGE REVITALIZATION

B.C. has incredible language diversity and is home to 34 First Nations languages, which make up more than half of all First Nations languages in Canada. Past colonial policy and the residential school system tried to extinguish Indigenous languages and cultures. That's why we are providing \$34.75 million to the First Peoples Cultural Council (FPCC) to support First Nations communities to revitalize their languages, cultures, arts and heritage.

June is Pride month here in Courtenay-Comox! Join me in celebrating Two-Spirit, Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer or Questioning (2SLGBTQ+) people with our community. The reality is that 2SLGBTQ+ people continue to face stigma and discrimination, which puts people at risk for much higher rates of violence, poverty, mental health



issues and other complex challenges. And this discrimination is compounded for Indigenous people and people of colour.

A more inclusive society leads to a higher quality of life for everyone, and I encourage you join me in standing against hate and bigotry.

Preparing for summer heat events

Last summer's unprecedented heat dome impacted all of us in some way, and for some it was tragic. It made it clear we need to do more as a province to be better prepared for extreme heat events. We've taken a number of steps to implement the lessons learned from last year's events to make sure B.C., and our healthcare system, is prepared and resilient during extreme weather events.



Thanks to our new BC Heat Alert and Response System, we will be ready to issue Broadcast Intrusive alerts for extreme heat emergencies to make sure people are aware and can take steps to protect themselves and their loved ones. This new system also includes a framework on when health and community agencies should enact wellness checks – for those people who may not have anyone close by to check on them.

Minister Blair announces over \$200 million to support disaster recovery and climate resilience in B.C

Last year's wildfires and floods demonstrated how important is to prepare our communities against future extreme weather events. Public Safety Canada is delivering an advance payment of \$207 million to the Government of British Columbia through the Disaster Financial Assistance Arrangements (DFAA) to support 2021 wildfire recovery efforts in British Columbia.

Agriculture advisory group to help create more resilient food supply

Together, regenerative agriculture and agritechnology can help us strengthen B.C.'s food system and food economy. This new Minister's Advisory group consisting of food production experts will help B.C. farmers access the latest technology, create more resilient farms, and increase sustainability.
