Resilient Environments - Resilient Economies

BC valley of ancient trees, rare animals preserved in deal with forest firm

We're committed to protecting BC's rich biodiversity. Known for its wildlife and old-growth forests, the Incomappleux Valley is a biologically unique place that will now be preserved. With more than 58,000 ha of remote wilderness supporting rare species of lichen & old-growth forests, the Incomappleux Valley is being made into a conservancy. This is one of the most significant new protected areas established in the past decade, and was made possible by working with First Nations, Interfor and the Nature Conservancy of Canada.



New forestry program will support manufacturing employment, resilient economies

British Columbians expect that we get the most value from our forests and create more jobs for every tree harvested. This is why now, secondary manufacturers have access to the timber they need to keep and create jobs for people here in B.C. With the need to transition from high volume to high value in our forestry sector, this is the right thing for the environment, our economy & our forests. We are working to create more good-paying jobs for people in rural British Columbia with the \$90 million BC Manufacturing Jobs Fund. This investment will help diversify local economies, promote value-added innovation in the forestry sector, and create thousands of good-paying jobs for people.

B.C. provides funding to expand use of fibre and support forestry workers

We know that access to fibre is one of the most critical challenges facing the forestry industry. Forestry workers and communities throughout the province will benefit from new funding for the Forest Enhancement Society of BC. This funding will increase fibre supply aimed at keeping people working and local mills running, while also mitigating wildfire risks and reducing climate emissions.

B.C. launches anti-racism action plan for K-12 students

Empowering students and educators to identify and take action against racism and discrimination in British Columbia schools is the aim of a new provincial K-12 Anti-Racism Action Plan launched on Monday, Jan. 23, 2023. The action plan will create change in B.C. schools by raising awareness and creating resources to improve the school experience for racialized students, staff and families so that everyone feels a strong sense of belonging.

Decriminalization small amounts of drugs and fighting stigma


The toxic drug supply crisis is a public health matter – not a criminal justice one.
